**MEMORY VERSE** Since you have been raised to new life with Christ, **set your sights** on the realities of **heaven**, where Christ sits in the place of honor at God's right hand. <sup>2</sup>**Think about** the things of **heaven**, not the things of earth. **COLOSSIANS 3:1-2** (NLT)

We, too, wait with eager hope for the day when God will give us our full rights as his adopted children, including the new bodies he has promised us.
